The Technology Fair is an interactive exhibition of cutting-edge products and applications that are successfully being integrated into environmental collaboration and conflict resolution processes.

At the Technology Fair, the U.S. Institute will highlight technology within the following categories: GIS, social media, decision support, visualization, monitoring/evaluation, and project management.

Attendees at the ECR 2012 Conference's Technology Fair will include representatives from federal departments and agencies, tribal, state, and local governments, mediators, facilitators, environmental advocates, NGO's, community-based groups, science and technical experts, and academics. Audience members will have a wide range of expertise working with various technologies.

Application Criteria:

Exhibitors will be evaluated from the perspective of the relevancy of the technology to the environmental collaboration and conflict resolution field. Exhibitions will feature tools over a range of categories, including GIS, social media, decision support, visualization, monitoring/evaluation, and project management. Exhibitors are encouraged to provide hands-on demonstrations of their technology and discuss how the technology can be applied to environmental collaboration and conflict resolution processes (ECCR).

Applications will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- The technology has been/can be applied to environmental collaboration and conflict resolution (ECCR) processes;
- The technology enhances/has the potential to enhance ECCR process and outcomes;
- The technology has the ability to address environmental conflicts or challenges and contributes to successful collaborative, dispute resolution, or decision-making processes;
- The technology is newly developed (within the last 2 years) or is an innovative application of an existing technology to an ECCR process;
- Exhibitors must be available to attend the Technology Fair at the ECR 2012 Conference, May 22-24, 2012, in Tucson, Ariz.

Selection Committee:

Applications will be evaluated by a panel of judges convened by the U.S. Institute for Environmental Conflict Resolution. The panel comprises expertise in ECR, mediation, technology development, and technology applications.
